Facts = "Information used as evidence or as part of a report or news article." - Google

> Each name, event date, event place, occupation, residence, employer, family member, friend, story element, piece of information, counts as a fact.

Clues = a piece of evidence or information.

Lead = Clue or piece of evidence that could lead to more information.

Sources = Where the information came from?

Research Question = What guestion arises from facts and clues given in evidence.

How many points of evidence can you find?

Hint: If you were creating a timeline of every event, each point on the timeline would count separately. Each person counts separately. Each clue counts separately. That's all I'm going to say.

Tallie E. Davis, 56, brother of David T. Davis, state mine inspector of this city, died suddenly Friday of a heart attack at Med-ford, Mass., according to word received on Saturday by local relatives.

He was the son of the late Jenkin and Elizabeth Davis, early scitlere of the West Side. For many years he resided on High Street, Plymouth. Starting his career in the coal business with Conyngham and Company he later became sales manager of the Susquehanna Col-lieries Company at Nanticoke. For the last 20 years Mr. Davis had been employed in the sales division of the Atlantic Coal Com-pany with headquartere at Mcd-ford, Mass. Before settling in that eity be resided for several years in Buffalo, N. Y. He was one of medford's prominent residents and served for several years as chair-man of the council in that city. How Many Facts can you find?

Answers to Facts:

- 1. Tallie E. Davis died on Friday April 12th, 1940.
- 2. He probably did not die on his birthday, or it likely would have been mentioned in the article.
- 3. Tallie E. Davis was 56 years old, when he died.
- 4. Tallie was **born between** 10th of April **1883** and 11th of April **1884**.
- 5. Tallie E. Davis was a native/born in Plymouth, Pennsylvania.
- 6. Tallie E. Davis died at Medford, Massachusetts.
- 7. Tallie E. Davis had a heart attack.
- 8. The paper was a **local newspaper**. A quick Google search reveals that Wilkes-Barre Township is just a few miles from Plymouth, PA.
- 9. Died suddenly (part of the life story). Might not have had a will.
- 10. Tallie lived in Medford, Massachusetts on April 12th, 1940.
- 11. Tallie E. Davis' occupation was in sales. He was a Sales Agent/Sales Manager/"worked in sales division.
- 12. The Industry Tallie worked in most of his life was Coal Mining.
- 13. Tallie E. Davis was working for Atlantic Coal Company when he died.
- 14. Tallie E. Davis was **male** by the use of he. Tallie was usually a girls name.
- 15. Tallie E. Davis had a brother named David T. Davis.
- 16. David T. Davis was a state mine inspector for "this city" is not clear (Wilkes-Barre or Plymouth).
- 17. David T. Davis lived in Plymouth/Wilkes Barre- PA, since he worked there... and "of this city."
- 18. Tallie E. Davis went to public school in Plymouth "... was born in Plymouth and was educated in that borough."
- 19. Tallie E. Davis went to Wyoming Seminary in Plymouth, PA.
- **20.** His father was Jenkin Davis.
- 21. His father (Jenkin Davis) had died by April 14th, 1940.
- 22. His mother Elizabeth Jenkin had died by April 14th, 1940.
- 23. His mother was Elizabeth (maiden name unknown) Jenkins.
- 24. Jenkin and Elizabeth Davis were early settlers of Plymouth, PA.
- 25. Jenkin and Elizabeth Davis first settled on the "West Side."
- 26. Tallie E. Davis resided for an unknown "many" years on High Street in Plymouth, PA.
- 27. Tallie's brothers also worked in the coal industry.
- 28. Tallie E. Davis worked *first* [years unknown] for Conyngham and Company.
- 29. Tallie E. Davis worked for Susquehanna Collieries Company at Nanticoke.
- 30. Tallie E. Davis worked for **Atlantic Coal Company from about 1920-1940**. The article said the "last 20 years."
- 31. Tallie's employer Atlantic Coal Company was in Medford, Massachusetts.
- 32. Tallie E. Davis lived in **Bedford, Massachusetts from about 1920-1940**. "Before settling in that city..."
- 33. Tallie E. Davis lived for an unknown time (until about 1920) in Buffalo, NY.

- 34. Tallie E. Davis was a prominent community member in Medford, MA.
- 35. Tallie E. Davis was a "chairman of council" in Medford, MA.
- 36. Tallie E. Davis was affiliated with various unnamed civic organizations in Medford, MA.
- 37. His wife was "Theresa" (unknown maiden name) assume Davis for a last name.
- 38. His wife Theresa died after 14 April 1940.
- 39. Tallie E. Davis had four sons.
- 40. Son Richard Davis (likely the oldest).
- 41. Son Eugene Davis (likely the second oldest son).
- 42. Daughter Elizabeth Davis (likely the oldest daughter)
- 43. Daughter **Charlotte Davis** (likely the youngest because she is at home).
- 44. Richard Davis was a student at Harvard University in 1940. Likely about 22.
- 45. Eugene Davis was a student at Massachusetts Tech in 1940. Likely 18-20.
- 46. Elizabeth was a student at La Salle College in 1940. Likely about 18-20.
- 47. Charlotte Davis was still living at home in 1940. Likely a teenager, possibly a child.
- 48. This **family was wealthy**, by evidence of the sons going to Harvard and Massachusetts Tech universities. Mass Tech is now MIT in Cambridge.
- 49. Tallie had a brother named Evor Davis.
- 50. Evor Davis lived in the Plymouth area.
- 51. Evor Davis worked for the Plymouth Mining Company.
- 52. The funeral for Tallie E. Davis was held in Medford, Massachusetts.
- 53. The funeral for Tallie E. Davis was held on a Monday afternoon (likely 15 April 1940).
- 54. Tallie was buried in Medford, Massachusetts (cemetery was not named).
- 55. Tallie's middle initial was E.
- 56. David T. Davis (Tallie's brother) was married at the time of the Tallie's death. "Mr. & Mrs. D.T. Davis..."
- 57. Tallie E. Davis died in Medford, Massachusetts, over 300 miles from home.

Answers to New Leads:

- 58. Since Jenkin and Elizabeth Davis were early settlers of Plymouth, PA, this implies they migrated from somewhere else and where not born there.
- 59. The fact that Tallie went to a local seminary, implies he was of a Christain religion.
- 60. Additional stories in this paper might be found on Sunday April 14th or after this April 15th article.
- 61. Research the Medford, MA newspapers around his death dates for more information.
- 62. Do a name search Tallie E. Davis in newspapers from about 1918-1940. (Adding a couple of years on the beginning since we don't have the exact year he moved there.)
- 63. Evor Davis might be single in 1940 at the time of Tallie's death as he traveled to the funeral with his brother David T. Davis and David's wife.
- 64. Mr. and Mrs. D.T. Davis and Evor Davis left Saturday [13 April 1940] for Medford, Massachusetts to attend the funeral.
- 65. Learn about the coal mining business.
- 66. Elizabeth Davis is born between about 1904-1940.
- 67. Charlotte Davis is born between about 1904-1940.


