Jurisdiction definitions

The classic Irish structure is Province → County → Barony → Civil Parish → Townland.

- There are four provinces, Ulster, Connacht, Leinster, & Munster, and 32 counties.
- Baronies were ancient political areas, but they are rarely used today.
- Civil Parishes were created when the Church of England took over the Catholic Church. These parishes then became the civil administration areas.
- Catholic Parishes and Civil Parishes often have name and geographic differences.
- Townlands are the smallest unit of land division and are key to finding your ancestor.

The other important structure is the Poor Law Union **aka** Registration District **aka** Superintendent Registrar's District.

- Poor Law Unions covered a 10 or 12-mile radius around a market town and may not conform to county or parish boundaries.
- Later Poor Law Unions became known as Registration Districts or because they were overseen by a Superintendent, Superintendent Registrar's Districts.
- Local Registrar's Districts are subdivisions of a Registration District.
- District Electoral Divisions are subdivisions of Local Registrar's Districts.

Besides the county and townland of your ancestor you will also need to know the following jurisdictions to search in Irish records.

Type of Record	Jurisdiction, Administrative or Land Division
Census	District Electoral Division. See 1901 Townland index below.
Civil Registration (Vital Records)	Poor Law Union/Registration District/Superintendent Registrar's District. Sometimes the local Registrar's District is needed to narrow results. See https://www.johngrenham.com/places/plu_index.php .
Catholic church	Catholic Parish. See https://www.johngrenham.com/places/rcmap_index.php .
Church of Ireland	Civil Parish. See https://www.johngrenham.com/places/civil_index.php .
Griffith's Valuation	Civil Parish. See above.
Tithe Applotment	Civil Parish. See above.

Civil Registration

- Non-Catholic Marriages began in 1845. All other Birth, Marriages and Deaths began in 1864. Online records released for births after 100 years, marriages after 75 years, and deaths after 50 years. Remember the Republic of Ireland & Northern Ireland separated in 1922.
 - Indexes & originals at <https://civilrecords.irishgenealogy.ie/>. Includes all of Ireland's births through 1916. Republic of Ireland's marriages through 1941 and deaths through 1966.
 - Indexes through "Ireland Civil Registration Indexes, 1845-1958" at <https://www.familysearch.org/search/collection/1408347>. Includes all of Ireland up to 1922 and the Republic of Ireland up to 1958. Reminder: The Event "place" is the Civil Registration District not the county or parish.
 - Partial **early** transcriptions with "event place" not consistently transcribed; could be just "Ireland" or county, parish, or townland.

 - "Ireland Marriages, 1619-1898" with spouse's & maybe parent's names thru 1870 at <https://www.familysearch.org/search/collection/1584964>.
 - "Ireland Deaths, 1864-1870" with occupation and marital status at <https://www.familysearch.org/search/collection/1584965>.

There is no one site that has all the records. Most records were microfilmed thru about 1880. After 1880 records are in local custody or sometimes on RootsIreland.ie.

- Griffith's Valuation was taken between 1847 and 1864 and listed the occupiers of land. Search at <http://www.askaboutireland.ie/griffith-valuation/>.
- Pre-Griffith's books from 1824 to 1856 are at <http://census.nationalarchives.ie/search/vob/home.jsp>.
- Post-Griffith's books are called Cancelled Land or Revision Books.
 - Republic of Ireland only available at the Valuation Office in Dublin.
